## Mentors/Christian Friends/ Transportation Needed

It really doesn't matter what you call it, there are ongoing needs among our refugees for Christians to love them and come along side them to help with their transition to American society. Here is one example among several:

We have a young widow who has recently arrived, who will soon deliver her third child. She is disabled, her assistance is pending and her (core services) with a local charity will finish soon. After that she will be responsible for herself and her children. Without help or instruction her life will be very difficult. She needs someone who is willing to help her and her kids, specifically to make doctor appointments. Remember what Jesus said, "Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto me.."

## iServe: Micro-grants

Introducing *iServe: Micro-grants!* iServe is a *Yes, Lord!* Community Ministries program which provides micro-grants of up to \$1,000 for groups initiating new community and neighborhood ministries. Look for needs in your neighborhood and get involved! Call the church office or visit [fbcса.org/iserve](http://fbcса.org/iserve) for more information and to apply! Here are some example projects:

- Develop an iPad lending library/reading club for senior adults
- Provide after school snacks for low income elementary school kids
- Build a community garden to connect residents in an older neighborhood
- Start an after school reading/tutoring program
- Host a Block Party to connect isolated, suburbanite neighbors
- Start a job training/preparation program such as Christian Women's Job Corp
- Purchase startup materials/tools for a micro-enterprise to provide income for a refugee family
