Expanding International Ministries Staff

As the International Ministries activity expands and as we seek to be better at our ministry among the refugees and other internationals, we have seen the need for additional part-time staff. The 2014 church budget includes provisions for a part-time (16 hours per week) administrative assistant dedicated to the International/Asian ministry. The new budget also provides funds for a part-time transportation coordinator to make sure all of our internationals are able to attend the activities of interest to them happening at FBC. This person would be responsible for coordinating the use of our resources both physical (buses, vans, etc) and personnel (drivers both paid and volunteer) to provide the most effective use of those resources. For more details see the job postings on the FBC website. Be in prayer that God will lead us in the selection of these important leaders.

Building Fund 2014 – New Proposal

With confidence in the leadership of the Lord and gratitude for His blessings in 2013, in the New Year the FBCSA family will consider a new building fund focus. Multiple phases are being proposed which will include 1st floor West Hall renovations for senior adults, 2nd floor West Hall Music Ministry space, a new two-story building with a choir rehearsal room, a new front door, and 3rd floor West Hall renovations, and visitor center areas in Kokernot Hall. More details to come. This is only a proposal for now! Much prayer and consideration still ahead. Thank you for your prayers and your help as we move forward together on these important additions to our facilities and ministries. We will begin these projects only as the funds become available.

2013 Christmas Care

Friday and Saturday we packed 240 boxes of food with the help 125 volunteers, from little ones to senior adults. We had 10 team leaders, who recruited their teams and delegated delivery assignments.

Our first group was Baptist Children and Family Services. They moved all of the food we had collected from west hall to the fellowship hall. Then they helped unload the truck and set up all the food in the packing area. They packed 60 boxes and with 85 Angel Tree gifts delivered them on Friday.

Friday night we had a group come in and pack all of the food boxes for Angel Tree, Spanish, deaf and Maintenance Staff.

Early Saturday morning we had two teams pack chickens in their boxes and coordinate their boxes with the 88 Angel Tree gifts and deliver them.

Next two teams came in to pack and deliver boxes to two elementary schools areas. Lamar (the school where FBC mentors and supplies backpacks) and Cable (a very poor area on the Westside of SA). The counselors and teachers had put together lists of their neediest families.

Last but not least, our International congregation came in and packed and delivered boxes to their newest families. Wayne Williams assisted in getting four teams of Burmese men.

None of this would have happened without support of the First Baptist congregation, bringing in food items or donating money to Christmas Care. Thank you for all of your support of Christmas Care and Angel Tree.

Best of all – one team told me of delivering a box to a family, where three small children lived – one little boy was so excited he announced "they brought us a box of food".
