

<sup>26</sup>But what did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. <sup>27</sup>This is the one about whom it is written:

"I will send my messenger ahead of you,

who will prepare your way before you.' <sup>28</sup>I tell you, among those born of women there is no one greater than John; yet the one who is least in the kingdom of God is greater than he."

<sup>29</sup>(All the people, even the tax collectors, when they heard Jesus' words, acknowledged that God's way was right, because they had been baptized by John. <sup>30</sup>But the Pharisees and experts in the law rejected God's purpose for themselves, because they had not been baptized by John.)

<sup>31</sup>"To what, then, can I compare the people of this generation? What are they like? <sup>32</sup>They are like children sitting in the marketplace and calling out to each other: "We played the flute for you, and you did not dance; we sang a dirge, and you did not cry.'<sup>33</sup>For John the Baptist came neither eating bread nor drinking wine, and you say, 'He has a demon.'<sup>34</sup>The Son of Man came eating and drinking, and you say, 'Here is a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and "sinners."'<sup>35</sup>But wisdom is proved right by all her children."
