

## **John 17:1, 6, 9, 15, 18, 20-21 (NIV)**

<sup>1</sup>“After Jesus said this, he looked toward heaven and prayed:

“Father, the time has come. Glorify your Son, that your Son may glorify you. <sup>6</sup>I have revealed you to those whom you gave me out of the world. <sup>9</sup>They were yours; you gave them to me and they have obeyed your word. <sup>15</sup>I pray for them. I am not praying for the world, but for those you have given me, for they are yours. My prayer is not that you take them out of the world but that you protect them from the evil one.

<sup>18</sup>As you sent me into the world, I have sent them into the world.

<sup>20</sup>My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, <sup>21</sup>that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me.”
