Better Broken 2 Samuel 11: 26-27

- **Bad**

“Evil in sight of the Lord” (v. 11:27); Hebrew – *rah*, “bad”

Bad deeds - Bad results

Mark 2:10 “The Son of Man has authority to forgive sins.”

- **Broken**

“I have sinned against the Lord” (v. 12:13)

“You have despised me” (v. 12:10)

Conviction/confrontation/confession

“A broken and contrite heart, O God, that will not despise.”

(Psalm 51:17)

- **Busy**

Deuteronomy 17:17 – a relationally complex life

- **Better**

Psalm 51 “Be gracious...cleanse...restore joy...do good to Zion.”

Acts 3:19 (NASB) “Therefore repent and return, so that your sins may be wiped away, in order that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord.”

A sadder and wiser man. Restored joy!
