¹Then the Lord spoke to Moses, saying, ²“Tell the sons of Israel to raise a contribution for Me; from every man whose heart moves him you shall raise My contribution. ³This is the contribution which you are to raise from them: gold, silver and bronze, ⁴blue, purple and scarlet material, fine linen, goat hair, rams’ skins dyed red, porpoise skins, acacia wood.

⁸Let them construct a sanctuary for Me, that I may dwell among them.

⁹According to all that I am going to show you, as the pattern of the tabernacle and the pattern of all its furniture, just so you shall construct it.

Sanctuary – *mikdash* – “holy place”

16 chapters of Exodus (minus 3 for golden calf)

- The Tabernacle taught WORSHIP.
Numbers 1:50

- The Tabernacle taught CONTRIBUTION.
Hebrew – *rum* – “to be high to rise” (*terumah*)
2 Corinthians 9:7 “Each one must do just as he has purposed in his heart, not grudgingly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.”

- The Tabernacle taught HUMILITY.
“Exactly like the pattern”
God has a plan – Ephesians 2:10; Jeremiah 1:5
The Tabernacle as a type of Christ

Matthew 17 – “The Transfiguration”

Matthew 17:5 “While he was still speaking, a bright cloud overshadowed them, and behold, a voice out of the cloud said, ‘This is My beloved Son, with whom I am well-pleased; listen to Him!’”
